

Reason For Exam
Barium swallow to eval for esophageal dysmotility

BEFORE HEALING

Finding:
BARIUM SWALLOW - 02/09/06:

INDICATION:
Dysphagia.

In the erect position, the esophagus fills and empties quite readily. No constricting lesions, inflammatory changes or filling defects are identified. With the patient recumbent, there is considerable delay in emptying along with a small sliding hiatal hernia. There is some mild transient dilatation also. The patient was given water to clear the esophagus, but this only cleared the barium minimally. The patient was then returned to the erect position and there was noted some residual barium even in the erect position. There is some lack of peristalsis.

CONCLUSION:
PERISTALSIS IS DIMINISHED, BUT THE ESOPHAGUS DOES EMPTY IN THE ERECT POSITION, BUT EMPHES POORLY IN THE RECLUMBENT POSITION. A VERY SMALL SLIDING HIATAL HERNIA IS PRESENT. I BELIEVE WE ARE DEALING BOTH WITH SOME MILD CARDIOSPASM, AS WELL AS SOME INTRINSIC DYSMOTILITY. WE COULD BE SEEING SOME OF THE EARLY CHANGES OF SCLERODERMA.
